Here's a bit about myself and what I do. As you know, my name is Robert Mauro, I was born in New York City on 9/25/46. In 1973 I moved out to Levittown, Long Island. I contracted polio at age five in 1951. I spent nearly two years at St. Charles Hospital in Port Jefferson, on Long Island. I was in an iron lung for about six months. I walked and road a two wheeler until I began feeling the affects of Post Polio Syndrome, in about 1969. By 1974, I could no longer ride a two wheeler. About 1970 I started using a respirator part time. By the mid 1980's I was using it full time. I began to use a motorized wheelchair in 1980. I can still walk, but only do so around my home. I do all my computing lying down, not being able to sit at a desk for long periods of time as a result of three spinal fusions, in 1960-61.

I received my B.A. (in Sociology) in 1976 from <u>Hofstra University</u> on Long Island, where my first play was produced, in 1971. After graduating in 1976, I made my first professional sale as a writer. Since then I've had four <u>books</u> published and three booklets.

Beginning in 1987, I started PeopleNet, my own international print personals/networking newsletter by and for disabled singles. Since August of 1987, PeopleNet has brought about a number of marriages. In September of 1995, PeopleNet was transformed into this home page.

I presently write the "Computer Talk" column for disabled computer users in Able Newspaper. I have written a booklet called "Total Computer Literacy By & For Disabled Persons," available from PeopleNet. I've also written a booklet on sexuality for disabled lovers called Real Crip Sex.

From 1986-1987 I wrote a monthly computer column for The Voice of the Physically Challenged.

From 1982 to the present I've been an administrative assistant at the Long Island Center for Independent Living, Inc. where I help out with their computer and do some of their editorial work.

I also started two Internet lists. Mobility@sjuvm.stjohns.edu and Polio@sjuvm.stjohns.edu. My main interest and occupation is writing. As I've said, I've written seven books and booklets. I hope you check them out. Ask your library or your local book store to order them. Or order them from me for yourself.
